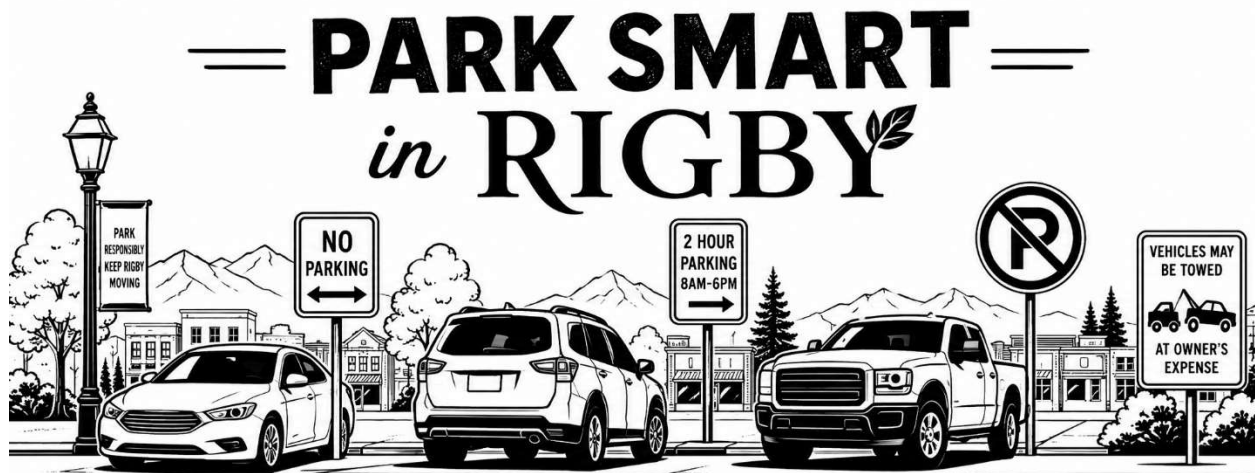




A Quick Guide to City Parking Regulations

 Most parking rules are common-sense safety rules designed to keep traffic moving, protect neighborhoods, and allow emergency vehicles access.

DO NOT PARK...

 **Blocking Flow-** Never park where less than 10 ft of road remains for traffic to pass.

 **In Alleys-** Do not park in an alley if you:

- Block a driveway.
- Leave less than 10 feet of roadway available for vehicles to pass.

 **On City Property-** Parking or driving is prohibited on:

-  Grass
-  Gravel areas
-  Parks
- Other City-owned property unless specifically marked for vehicle parking.
- Violators may be fined, cited, and vehicles may be towed.

 **For Vehicle Sales or Repairs-** City streets are not for:

- Displaying vehicles for sale.
- Washing vehicles.
- Mechanical repairs (except emergency repairs).

Truck & Bus Parking

Large tractor-trucks and trailers may not park on City streets except:

- ✓ While actively loading or unloading.
- ✓ On approved streets designated by City ordinance.
- ✓ With a permit issued by the Chief of Police.

 Vehicles transporting flammable or hazardous materials may not park within the City except while actively loading or unloading.

Recreational Vehicles, Boats & Trailers

RVs, boats, service vehicles, and trailers may not remain parked on City streets for more than 48 consecutive hours.

Oversized Vehicles

Vehicles over 6 feet in width may park on certain narrow streets for up to one hour while loading or unloading unless additional permission has been granted.

Park the Right Way

Always:

- ✓ Park facing the direction of traffic.
- ✓ Park within 18 inches of the curb.
- ✓ Use angle parking only where it is designated.

Obey Posted Signs

Many parking restrictions are only enforceable where official signs have been installed.

Examples include:

- School zones
- Loading zones
- No Parking areas
- Time-limited parking

 Always obey posted parking signs and restrictions.

Vehicles May Be Towed

Vehicles creating a hazard or parked illegally may be:

- ✓ Ticketed
- ✓ Towed
- ✓ Stored at the owner's expense

❄️ Winter Parking & Snow Removal ❄️ November 1 – March 15

🚫 **Winter Parking Restrictions** - To allow City crews to safely plow streets, overnight parking is restricted during the winter season.

- Downtown & Town Square: No parking between 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m.
- Residential Streets: No parking between 2:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. (Noon)

Rigby City Code states: *"No person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle upon a public street during the designated winter parking restriction hours established by the City."*

Vehicles parked during restricted hours may be ticketed or towed if necessary to allow for snow removal.

💡 **Keep Snow Out of the Street**- Please do not push, shovel, blow, or throw snow into City streets, including the snow left at the end of your driveway after the plow passes.

- Idaho Code § 18-3907 makes it unlawful to place materials or obstructions in a public roadway that interfere with safe travel. Snow placed into the street can create hazardous driving conditions and increase snow removal costs.
- If you do not have room for snow on your property, consider hiring a snow removal service.

🏠 **Property Owner Responsibilities:** To help keep our community safe and accessible:

- Clear sidewalks adjacent to your property within 24 hours after snowfall ends.
- Keep fire hydrants accessible whenever possible.
- Do not block sidewalks or public rights-of-way with snow piles.

These efforts help children walking to school, emergency responders, mail carriers, and neighbors with limited mobility.

❤️ **Be a Good Neighbor** - Winter weather affects everyone.

If you are able, consider helping a neighbor who may have difficulty clearing snow. Small acts of kindness help keep Rigby a safe and welcoming community all winter long.
